

**Creation: Read about it or Be about it.**

or

***In the Beginning....will you be there?***

"*In the Beginning...*" The words sound familiar perhaps so familiar that we do not pay enough attention to them. The High Holiday season (including Sukkot and Shmini Atzeret) concluded last week and Jews begin the reading of the Torah afresh. But do we? Have we read or heard the description of Creation so many times that we have become insensitive to what the words tell us happened? Or can happen?

### Your Favorite Part

Recently, I had the privilege of leading a conversation with patients in a psychiatric unit. I asked them their favorite part of creation. Thinking Biblically myself and knowing I was in the Bible Belt, I was prepared to hear answers according to the days of creation described in Genesis - light on day 1, the heavens on day 2, .... But, as often happens, the students became my teachers as they came up with amazing response after amazing response. One said his favorite part of creation was *G-d* (okay, he actually said Jesus, but the point is to learn a lesson, not argue over various faiths or their names for G-d). How wonderful and refreshing to think of Creation as the source rather than the product! Another participant suggested his favorite part was *Free Will*. This wise person was reminding me that whatever is in the text is only the beginning of the beginning - we actually have a significant role in seeing how the beginning ends.

There were responses about specific objects of creation, but each one with a twist which stretched and humbled me. One man liked the *birds* because they inspire him toward the development of the aviation industry. One focused on *nature* because he liked to hike and fish and hunt. A young man answered that his favorite part of creation was *woman* because having a partner and love was so precious. And, fittingly, the final participant answered that his favorite part of Creation was *Rest* - because that is where all of Creation came together was able to be appreciated.

I was so proud of the discussion I had witnessed and wonder what other amazing answers would be generated if only more of us - all of us - would brave to engage in the question. Being engaged in Creation is a Human and Jewish gift. It completely changes our perspective and our outcome in life. It is life.

Being a spectator is not the same as being a participant - not in exercise that our bodies need, not study that our minds need, not in prayer that our souls need.

We can stand by and watch or completely turn our backs. Indeed, that is our *Free Will*, I suppose. I wonder, though, if that is actually *choosing life* or saying and choosing that *In the Beginning...* is only the beginning of the end for us.

### Creationism vs Evolution

This is not the space for an elongated discussion about Evolution (although such a discussion is important and valuable). Perhaps it is okay for the purpose of this present conversation to re-think Evolution not as "did primates develop over a long period of time from other forms of life", but rather are we ourselves using the tools of Creation to evolve/develop/grow into the active, thinking, loving, faithful beings that we have the capacity to be? That is what it means for us to be created in the image of G-d. That is what is available to us if only we were not so familiar with the words that we do not really listen to them any more. Not just the words in the first chapters of Genesis, but the stories and lessons of Abraham, Moses and the whole Torah; the uplifting words of gratitude, praise and connection in the Siddur.

Now is the time. Creation is here.

As the cycle of reading the Torah is renewed, may we each be blessed to be participants in Creation and not spectators. May we be attentive and studious, creative and courageous. May we use our personal experience to inform us rather than make us callous. May all our dreams of the future start with our opening our hearts to now and being part of... *In the Beginning*.

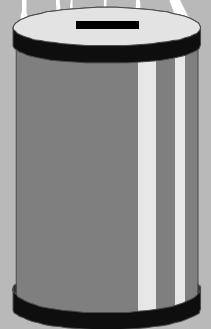
