Sacred Friendship

The Light between Condemning and Condoning

To be a friend is wonderful connection. It is fun and loving. It means being present for one another through ups and downs. It means supporting one another. Sometimes, we think it means being willing to do **anything** for one another.

And that is where we can go very wrong!

Because friendship is not the only connection that matters. We are not truly being a friend when we participate - either actively or tacitly - in the severing of other important relationships in the lives of our friends. Not when we are kids and they want to run away from home because they were grounded; not when we are young and wild and cover up each other's crimes; not when we jeopardize studies or employment in the name of fun; not when we enable or conceal behavior which can ruin a marriage or distance themselves from their own children. Being a friend in all those instances, and more, means helping the person we care about build better relationships with others - not put them at risk. Sometimes the friendly thing to do is to lovingly say no. Not because we don't care, but because we care enough about the big picture to take a hit as a party-pooper at the moment.

There is another type of connection that a true friend cherishes in another - and that is their connection with themselves. Of course, this means not helping someone do themselves bodily harm, G-d forbid. But it also means discouraging them from violating their personal integrity. We all have and need to have values, beliefs, principles and ethics which we hold SACRED - things which define and refine our lives. Whether we call this our faith or our value-system or our inner-essence, it is as integral to "who we are" as our physical health and when it erodes we are diminished.

To be a true friend, a SACRED friend, means not just saying yes to whatever is asked, but caring that our friend does not lose his/her way in life. We all face situations where our values and ethics are challenged. It is natural and easy to feel weak and give in. But this is precisely when we need to be strong and maintain our integrity. This is when we need a true friend to support us by reminding us what we ourselves hold sacred and to be strong when we ourselves may feel weak. This is when we need a SACRED friend to be our Lighthouse.

Lighthouses do not criticize or condemn. That is not loving or helpful. But Lighthouses also do not move. They do not go with the flow. They do not condone or justify that which is not right and true. The gift of a lighthouse is that it **continually shines the light of integrity** when one goes lost. It may not be easy or popular at the moment, but we need our true friend to be our Lighthouse. Otherwise how could any of us find our way back home?

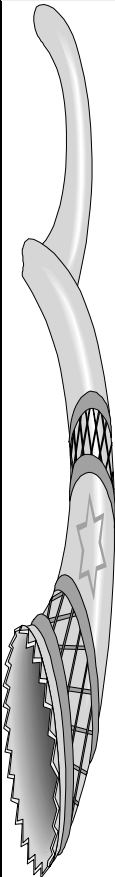
For a friendship to be SACRED, though, it must be respectful of the LIGHT in both directions. Just as a friend has the reasonable expectation to not be condemned when they veer off their own course, so too must they relinquish the demand to be condoned and validated for whatever they do. Even good, loving friends might have somewhat different faith/value systems. Sacred friends will find a way to allow each other to stay true to their own integrity - knowing that their enduring friendship is based on them having a lot in common - not being the same. Sacred friends respect the Light within the other person and appreciate that love does not always come in the shape of agreement.

As we clean up from Chanukkah, may we invite the Light to continue to shine - the Light of integrity which tells us who we are, the similar-yet-different Light in the eyes/soul of our friends and the Sacred Light of Friendship which neither condemns nor condones, but rather connects us lovingly and brings us home.

My inaugural message begins with a sincere and grateful thank you to the outgoing Board of Directors and past President Karen Mackey. Karen's leadership and love for our Congregation was to lead by example. Despite being a fulltime working parent, Karen participated in every aspect of synagogue life. Her energy and commitment was outstanding. Karen remains totally committed as reflected by her request to lead the membership committee, which I fully endorse and accept. I wish to thank outgoing Board members, Valerie Steinberg, Leonard Hasson, and Melanie Pilcher for their service to the congregation. Queen Val served for 26 consecutive years and wore many crowns. Her leadership will be missed, but she deserves break. I will continue to reach out to Val for guidance. Leonard, your friendship and advice have been a treasure to our Board and our house of worship. While I will miss your wise counsel, I am most grateful that you have graciously agreed to replace me as Chair of the Finance Committee. Leadership is not lacking. I am excited with the new Board of Directors. As you can see, I have stacked my Board with smart people. Every Jewish parent wants their child to be a doctor, do they not? We have doctors! Thank you to Dr. Sue Weinstein and Dr. Terri Cohen for agreeing to serve as 1st and 2nd Vice Presidents, respectively. Thank you to Dr. Gary Weisbly for returning to the Board as an at-large member and continuing service on the Finance Committee. Thank you to new board members Dr. Jim Aronson, Dr. Michael Fraiss and Dr. Michael Kuperman for agreeing to serve. Dr. Victor Biton remains on the Board as a past President. Monica Lulky joins the Board. She worked as a nurse and could have become a doctor, but she and William decided that fulfilling the Commandment to be fruitful and multiple was more important! I also appreciate the Executive Board with returning Treasure, Michael Margolis, Financial Secretary, Polly Greenbaum and new Recording Secretary, Toni Roosth. A special thanks to Richard Steppach who serves on multiple committees, including Building and Grounds as well as the Cemetery Committee. The Board of Directors has agreed to serve out of love for our members and our house of worship. They are not compensated for their service. They are all committed to our common goal, to grow and survive as a Congregation.

I have suggestions which I will share with the new Board to increase membership. I am confident that the entire Board will cooperate and work to achieve our common goals. We need your participation. 2016 was the public opening of the Museum of Jewish Life-Agudath Achim. Over 300 visitors walked through during this inaugural year. These were privately conducted tours where many were introduced to Judaism in Little Rock, Arkansas and around the world. Most of those learned of our museum through the wonderful article written in the Arkansas Democrat-Gazette in January.

As late as November, reaction to the article continued to elicit new visitors. Others dropped by on their own. Visitors ranged from Texas to Oregon, Georgia, and Israel and beyond.

Tours have been enhanced incredibly by the living testimony of Eva Zeno. Visitors are fascinated and blessed to hear her. We receive wonderful letters of appreciation afterwards.

January opens with the Museum welcoming students from Little Rock Christian Academy. Over 20 students and chaperones will be visiting during their week long study of Israel, her history and her defenses. Debi Steppach will be lecturing at LRCA, finalizing with a tour of the Museum.

The Jewish Federation of Arkansas (JFAR) will hold its annual Jewish Food and Cultural Festival at War Memorial Stadium in Little Rock, Arkansas.

Festival is from 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Admission to the festival is free.

JFAR is preparing to host more than **15,000 visitors**, hoping to surpass its previous attendance record.
