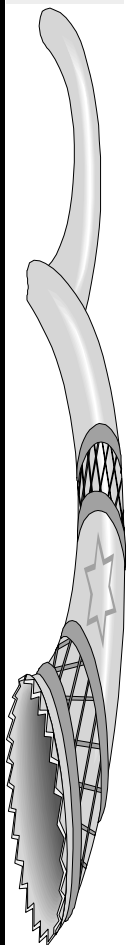

## Rabbi's Message...

Rabbi Kalman Winnick

### History, Her-Story or Your-Story

'Tis the Season.... not just for Pumpkin Spiced Latte (I guess that is an Autumn "thing" now) or the sights and sounds and sales of the winter holidays. As an involved Jew, rather, it is the season we begin where the Jewish Holidays left off....

*Rosh HaShanah* reminded us of the mystery and majesty of Creation. *Yom Kippur* drew us inward and upward - reconnecting us with ourselves, with each other and with G-d. *Sukkot* brought our awareness to the good fortune of our bounty and to the joy saying thank you while sharing it with others. *Simchat Torah* celebrated the conclusion of the yearly cycle of reading the Torah.

It is so easy as a Jew to pack away the *Shofar* and the *Sukkah*, to clean up one more time from all the Holiday meals and then to sigh a breath of relief that we are done until *Chanukkah*. But that is not what our tradition guides us to do. Rather, upon reading in Deuteronomy of Moses' last words of teaching and wisdom for the Jewish people before he died obediently on his 120th birthday, we immediately start reading the Torah again from page 1 (actually the Torah, Talmud and many Jewish Holy books all begin on page 2, but you know what I mean).

"In the Beginning...." The plot is familiar. We read of the glorious process Creation - "and G-d saw it was Good". We witness the demotion from Paradise. We rejoice at the first marriage and lament the first murder. We read who begat whom, but then see that violence also begat violence until the world was unsavable - except for Noah. We see rebuilding after the Flood - either an ill-fated attempt to build a tower or an attempt at spiritual rebuilding via a rebellious and starry-eyed man named Abram. The journey of Abram becomes the chronicle of the family of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob; which becomes the history under Moses of a Jewish Nation; which becomes a blueprint and dream for a better world that strives to actualize "and G-d saw it was Good".

The text of the Torah is no different this year than it was in years past. It could feel frustrating or even a waste of time to re-read it - especially since objectively it makes no difference in the world. Are we simply stuck in a pointless, endless loop like Phil Connors (played by Bill Murray) in *Groundhog Day*? Maybe we are. Or maybe, we are until we rethink the seat from which we watch the story - the world - unfold. Are we the audience or are active participants in the production?

Is Creation something we simply read about or are we the Creation - or even in some ways the Creators? Is Paradise a faraway notion or at our fingertips waiting for our next move? Is violence (physical, verbal, emotional, financial) only a "them" problem or something that lurks within every one of us? Do we seek to find favour in G-d's eyes like Noah? Are we willing to faithfully blaze a new path like Abram and Sarai - changing ourselves into the Abraham or Sarah we can be? Do we see ourselves as integral members of a Holy Family, a Holy Nation, a Better World?

In *Groundhog Day*, Phil Connors broke out of his monotonous cycle not by expecting the world to change, but by changing himself and how he interacted in the world. He went from watching helplessly to being an active agent that little by little impacted the final outcome for the better.

It is time to begin reading the Torah again. If we view the text as a boring retelling of history, then what is the point? But if we see the text as a journal of OUR lives (past, present and future), our interest, attention level and efforts may change.

"It is a Tree of Life to those who hold fast to it and all its supporters are happy".

May we be blessed as individuals and as a People to hold fast as active partners in the world - active in our study, in our faith and in our behavior. Through our active participation may we not only find that which will make us happy, but also help actualize the ultimate and final dream of Creation: "And G-d saw all that He ("He" meaning G-d or "he" meaning mankind = we?) had made and behold it was VERY Good". May that not just be history or a dream, but may it be our story and a reality.

'Tis the Season. As of the moment of this writing, Abram and Sarai are just getting ready to answer HaShem's call to move from the sidelines to the main stage. Are we - are you! - ready to do the same?

The only costs involved third party expenses which were paid by two of our members. Collectively, we all owe our sincere gratitude to this funeral home for its kind and generous deed, together with our continued support of the services they provide, which eventually we all will need. Thank them whenever you have the opportunity. It is the nearest we have to a Jewish Funeral Home in Little Rock.
